

On September 28, 2021, the Governor of Virginia, Ralph Northam, announced that Schock GmbH, a German sink manufacturer, will invest \$85 million to establish its first quartz composite sink production facility in the United States in Henry County. The 95,500 square-foot facility located in the Lot 8 Shell Building on 14.7 acres within the Patriot Centre Industrial Park marks the company's first expansion outside of Germany. This investment will create 355 new jobs.

Since its inception in 1924 and with its invention of the quartz composite sink in 1979, Schock has taken a traditional craftsmanship approach when it comes to their product development. The company holds over 100 patents and offers more than 200 sink models in more than 40 colors among its product lines, including an environmentally-conscious line made from approximately 99% natural, renewable, or recycled raw materials.

Schock is just the latest in sustainable manufacturing recruited to Martinsville-Henry County, with its announcement closely following that of Crown Holdings in early 2021. Attracted to the area for its natural beauty, strong workforce, and prime location, these new companies not only add to our thriving economic climate, but also help to grow and support our diverse community.

For the last twenty years I've traveled throughout the world and met some fantastic people, however Martinsville is the most welcoming place I've ever been to, with genuinely friendly people, that have made me feel so happy and comfortable. The Martinsville Made sub-brand focuses on recruiting new talent and highlighting current industries in Martinsville-Henry County.

- + Modern Industry Exchange (MIX) Program: Manufacturing Day is celebrated nationwide every year at the beginning of October. In an effort to showcase the advanced manufacturing facilities found in Martinsville-Henry County, the EDC produced a video web series offering an insider view of ActivWall, Hardide, Monogram Food Solutions, Virginia Glass, and Virginia Mirror. This video series was posted to social media and shared with local high schools as a way to connect skills learned in the classroom with modern manufacturing environments.
- + Virginia Values Veterans (V3): To help support military service members transitioning to the civilian workforce, the EDC facilitates the V3 training program for businesses looking to recruit, hire, and retain veterans.

A total of 11 employers are currently certified through the program.

- + Martinsville Made Job Board: This aggregate job board allows users to see jobs posted across many employers in Martinsville-Henry County in one place. Job seekers can search by keyword or within featured job categories to help streamline the process.
- + Housing Updates: The newly renovated Chief Tassel Building held its public tour in April 2022 closely followed by the Five Points Neighborhood in May. These projects help to meet the need for housing at all levels through renting or mortgaging.

Current housing projects: Aaron Mills Apartments, John Redd Smith School renovation, and the Fieldale School renovation.

- + 2022 Summer Internship Program: Due to the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, the summer internship program was paused in 2021. Recruitment began again at the start of 2022, with over 150 intern applicants across six initial industry positions.
 - The current program is operating with three interns at Eastman and one intern at Bassett Furniture.
- + Relocation Guide: The relocation guide is a condensed resource for new transplants and those considering a move to the area. Printed with a companion tourism guide, it offers information on living, working, and moving to Martinsville-Henry County.




